# I'll Walk You Home

t was a very simple encounter. Two people, probably husband and wife, on their way home from Jerusalem to a neighboring village, are joined by a lone traveler walking on the same path. The couple was downcast for some reason, and the lone traveler showed interest and concern. It was nothing out of the ordinary, just simple human interest. However, it's often just such an unexpected situation that becomes a profound event of God.

Jesus was talking beside them, explaining their sacred writings, and they did not recognize him. What would it take for them to realize the identity of their companion? As he appeared to continue his journey, they offered him hospitality: "Stay with us" (Luke 24:29). Though they didn't understand who he was or everything he had said to them, their hearts were open to him and so he stayed. "At table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them" (Luke 24:30). That did it! Now they knew. "He was made known to them in the breaking of bread" (Luke 24:35).

This is another moving story about the past and the present. How often we fail to recognize Jesus in our midst. He is with us in the very ordinary events of life, like walking home or preparing a meal. He is there even in our misunderstandings and disappointments. When we realize this, our hearts burn within us. We begin to see that the entire world is a place of encounter. Every human action holds the possibility of revelation.



- Dress for Mass! Put on your "Sunday best" - even if watching from your living room.
- 2. Prep! Read the readings before Mass. (www.usccb.org)
- Silence! Quiet yourself and your surroundings even for just a few minutes.
- 4. Call to mind your personal intentions. If you are with your family or a small gathering of friends, share those intentions out loud. Remember to include the sick, the lonely, those who are afraid. and all those who care for the sick.
- 5. Stand-sit-kneel! Sing-respond-listen! Act like you are in the Presence of God. (You ARE in His presence. You are present in church, mentally and spiritually)
- 6. Make a Spiritual Communion. There is a vast treasury of these
  prayers. Find one that feeds your soul.
  7. GIVE THANKS! Pause for a
  moment after the broadcast ends.
  8. GET HUNGRY! Long for your
  next Holy Communion. Get excited to
  pray with your brothers and sisters in
  our church again. Resolve to never
  grumble again about getting up early
  on a Sunday or when someone takes
  "your" parking space or "your" pew".

I am getting antsy to see people sitting in the pews again. Just as you are probably anxious to sit in them again. Pray for God's help in ending this crisis! Blessings through His Resurrected Son Jesus Christ!

# Dear Padre,

# Why couldn't the disciples recognize Jesus after the resurrection? Do you think we would recognize Jesus if he came back today?

**B** efore the resurrection, Jesus likely would have suffered the ravages of illness and lack of proper nutrition that all the people of his time were subject to. After the resurrection, Jesus showed he was exalted with the very power of God. Even his physical appearance had changed.

In view of his glorified appearance, the disciples were able to recognize Jesus with the aid of his marks of the passion (John 20:20). No one would go to the extreme of putting nails through his own hands and feet and thrust a spear into his side to pretend he was Jesus! He bore those marks, so he had to be the Lord.

Another purpose of showing his disciples his glorified body was to assure them we would undergo a similar glorification. In the resurrection we shall be completely changed and perfected in our humanity (1 Corinthians 15:52).

We are sometimes slow to recognize our Lord in the ways he indicated he would be with us today:

in the Eucharist (John 6:53); in the poor (Matthew 25:40); in his body, the Church (1 Corinthians 12:12). Coming to recognize him among us in these ways today will ensure we are more like him in our resurrection.
