

Our diocese, in conjunction with the Archdiocese of Chicago, is seeking volunteers to help assure at the Masses, at each church, we are adhering to social distancing guidelines and disinfecting after each Mass.

Besides myself, we need 6 more people to form a team to work out our guidelines for each of our three churches. We would need 2-3 people from each church. There is a webinar online through the Archdiocese of Chicago which we will need to complete so we can get certification to open the churches back up. So please let us know at the office if you are able to help! The sooner we get people certified, the sooner we will be able to get people back into church.

Current Mass Schedule And Holy Communion

The Mass schedule we will be using for all weeks other than the week with the Monday evening Mass for Reparation of Sins is what you see on the Mass schedule this week until the social distancing is a thing of the past. On weekends, I will be rotating back and forth the Saturday 4PM and Sunday 11:00AM Masses between Holy Trinity and St. Thomas More. Again the times are what they are for people without internet access to watch EWTN and then come for Holy Communion in the church parking lots.

Holy Communion starts 5-10 minutes after the end of Mass and continues until at least Saturday 5:10PM or Sunday 12:05PM! Then Father will at St. Patrick's for Holy Communion at Saturday 5:30PM or Sunday 12:30PM. Also distribution of Holy Communion is at 6PM on Sunday's at St. Thomas More.

The next confessions will be at St. Thomas More in parking lot on Saturday, on June 13th from 11-11:45am.

End Times Conference

The final conference on the End Times and what we need to do to be prepared for them will be a week from this Wednesday on June 3rd.

The third conference will be about what we need to do in preparation for the things coming to our world that will greatly affect our lives. Plenty to be thankful for! May God always protect us and be with us!


Dear Padre,

I look forward to every Pentecost Sunday, when I am renewed in God's spirit. Recently I read an article that said the Holy Spirit is a she.

Is the Holy Spirit female?

The third person of the Trinity is the Holy Spirit. The word *spirit* is a translation of the Hebrew word *ruah*, which can mean "breath," "air," or "wind." This is the wind that God first sent to create the world, it is the breath that God breathed into Adam and Eve, and it is the tongues of fire that the apostles experienced on the first Pentecost.

In Hebrew, the word used for the Holy Spirit is feminine. In Greek, the word used is neuter, and in Latin, the word used is masculine. Not surprisingly, this caused a few



We believe that in the life of the Trinity, God the Creator begets the Son. The expression of the love between God and the Son is the Holy Spirit. Perhaps we shouldn't think of the Holy Spirit as being either gender. Saint John describes the Holy Spirit as being God's love (see 1 John 4:7–13).
